

The reluctant assassin is Riley, a Victorian boy who is suddenly plucked from his own time and whisked into the twenty-first century, accused of murder and on the run.




The Truth by Zizou Corder


Boy Soldier by Andy McNab

Initially, the series follows James Choke, better known as James Adams (his adopted name at CHERUB), as he enters CHERUB and performs various missions. However, the focus later turns to his sister Lauren and several other characters who work alongside him, and in separate missions. The initial series of twelve novels runs from the recruitment of Adams to his retirement from CHERUB at age seventeen. A second series was announced in 2010 that follows Ryan Sharma, another CHERUB agent.



Zak becomes Agent 21. What happened to the 20 agents before him he'll never know. What he does know is that his life is about to change forever.




Holes by Loius Sachar
