


What's so special about the month of May?








May is Mary's Month

Here are 3 ideas of things you could do at home to Celebrate May the Month of Mary





Idea 1

Make your own Shrine to Mary in your house You could use:

A Mary Statue

Blue paper or material

Flowers

Mary holy cards

Mary books

Rosaries

Candles

Mary crafts you have made

Drawings or artwork of Our

Lady

Idea 2

Make a Mary Queen of Heaven Cake

- The cake is shaped like a crown. Mary is known as the Queen Of Heaven and also as the Queen Of The Saints, so a crown shape is perfect for her!
- It includes Mary's colour- blue. We know blue is Mary's symbolic colour. We see her wearing blue over and over again. The blueberries do a good job of reminding us of Mother Mary.
- White symbolises Mary's purity. The whiteness of the cake and the sprinkle of the bright white sugar on the top symbolises that purity.







Recipe

2 ½ sticks of butter

3 cups sugar

5 eggs

3 cups flour

½ teaspoon baking powder

1 cup milk

2 teaspoons lemon extract

1 teaspoon vanilla extract


2 cups of blueberries (If your

blueberries are frozen, first you will want to run them under water until

they are thawed. Then pat them dry.)

a few pinches of powdered sugar

Preheat your oven to 180 C



- The add eggs in and mix it well.
- In a separate bowl, combine the flour and baking powder together.
- Take your flour mixture and add a little of that to your sugar mixture, then a little of the milk, back and forth alternately to the sugar mixture. Put about 1 cup of your blueberries into the bottom of your pan.
- With a spoon, fold the rest of your blueberries into the cake batter.
- Then pour the batter into your pan.
- Bake the cake 1 1/2 hours or until an inserted toothpick comes out clean.
- When the cake is finished, allow the pan to sit on a wire rack until it is completely cooled.
 Carefully run a butter knife around the edges of the pan to help loosen the cake.
- Put your cake plate on top of your pan and flip it over to place your cake on the plate.
- Dust the outside of the cake with just a little bit of powdered sugar.


Maybe you could Pray a decade of the Rosary with your family every day though May



The ROSARY

The word Rosary means "Crown of Roses".

Our Lady has visited many people, including: Saint Dominic, Saint Bernadette at Lourdes and the three children at Fatima: Lucy, Jacinta and Francisco –



And said that each time they say a Hail Mary they are giving her a beautiful rose and that each complete Rosary makes her a crown of roses.



Saint Dominic

Legend says that the rosary owes its origin to Saint Dominic.



Dominic received a vision from Our Lady who showed him a wreath of roses, representing the rosary.

She told him to say the rosary daily and to teach it to all who would listen.

Dominic was one of the first people to begin to pray the rosary.

St Dominic - Feast day: August 8th

Saint Bernadette




When Bernadette saw Mary, she was dressed all in white, with a blue sash around her waist. She was wearing a white veil on her head and a yellow rose on each foot. She was holding a rosary in her hands.



What is the Rosary?

Think of what you do when you visit an art gallery: you GAZE at the paintings.



The Rosary helps us to "gaze" upon Jesus and upon moments in his life and in the life of his Mother, Mary.


We call that "gazing" meditation.


But sometimes it's not easy to focus or concentrate...too many worries, concerns, and distractions get in the way!

The Rosary invites us to 'visit' four such 'rooms' where we gaze upon certain scenes from the life of Jesus and Mary.

The Joyful Mysteries



The Annunciation

Mary learns that she has been chosen to be the mother of Jesus.

The Visitation

Mary visits Elizabeth, who tells her that she will always be remembered.

The Nativity

Jesus is born in a stable in Bethlehem.

The Presentation

Mary and Joseph take the infant Jesus to the Temple to present him to God.

The Finding of Jesus in the Temple

Jesus is found in the Temple discussing his faith with the teachers.

The Luminous Mysteries (Mysteries of Light)



The Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan

God proclaims that Jesus is his beloved Son.

The Wedding Feast at Cana At Mary's request, Jesus

performs his first miracle.

The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God

Jesus calls all to conversion and service to the Kingdom.

The Transfiguration of JesusJesus is revealed in glory to

Peter, James, and John.

The Institution of the Eucharist

Jesus offers his Body and Blood at the Last Supper.



The Sorrowful Mysteries



The Agony in the Garden Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night before he dies.

The Scourging at the Pillar Jesus is lashed with whips.


The Crowning With Thorns

The Coming of the Holy Spirit


The Holy Spirit comes to bring new life to the disciples.

At the end of her life on earth, Mary is taken body and soul into heaven.


The Coronation of Mary

Mary is crowned as Queen of Heaven and Earth.






pray the Rosary.

In a similar way, we begin the Rosary with a 'warm up'.




The Apostles Creed


I believe in God the Father Almighty,


And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord:

from there he shall come to judge the living and the dead.


