Message from the PTFA

We need you! Please help us to carry on supporting our students - without new volunteers, we may not be able to continue.

Who we are - Choosing NDHS as the secondary school for your young person means that you are all automatically invited to be a part of our Parents Teachers and Friends Association. Some of you will have seen us at the Year 7 summer BBQ, or at various concerts and productions in school. It is a highly sociable group and we meet monthly (where possible) in the school staff room but also welcome people online who can't get to us. Meetings usually run for about 30-60 minutes.

Unfortunately since Covid and due to many working parents/ people with additional commitments, we are very few in number and, in the summer, our co chairs, Jo and Paula will be standing down. *In order to prevent the group from folding (as many other PTA groups have done), we are looking for volunteers to come forward and help.* Ideally at least 2 from each year group. We don't expect a commitment to every single event/ meeting and there is no obligation /contract! However, it would be nice to have extra pairs of hands and any new ideas for fundraising. It's usually good fun too!

What we do - We run the 200 club- which is drawn monthly- you should all have had a form for this when you joined. In addition to this we try to run at least one yearly raffle as well as a bar at the summer and Christmas concerts and the summer welcome BBQ. In the past (pre Covid) we have also run some fundraising evenings.

Donations and sales at these events are put in a fund that can be bid for if extra money is needed for in school 'extras' that can help to enhance school life for your young people. In the last few years we have contributed to a wide range- from a lathe to an altar, books, robots, competition entries, pastoral rewards, a sports trophy, cheerleading kit, outdoor football tables, lighting (drama), D of E licence and laptops as well as on site experiences and trips to Walsingham, the geography field trip, and the Japan trip- all of which enhance the children's time at school.
