

Summary for parents: results of our survey on our Remote Teaching Contingency plan

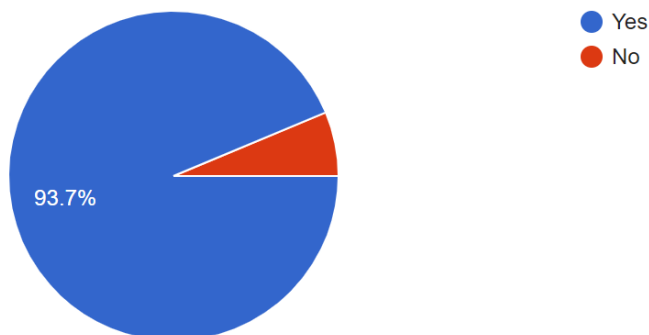

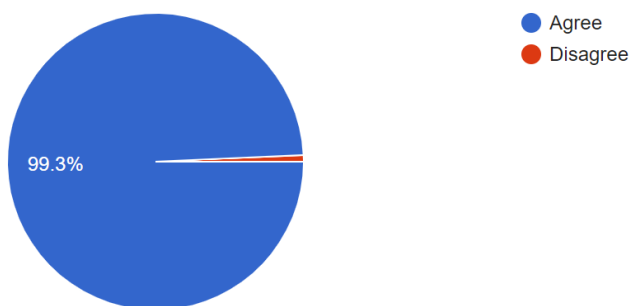

[Dark green: suitable equipment, but it has to be shared between siblings, or with parents working from home]

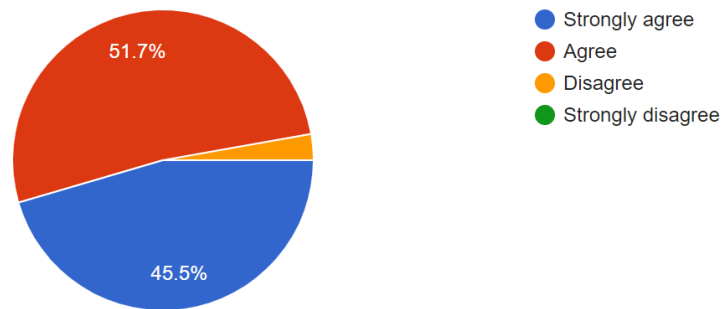
I understand the school's strategy for using google classrooms to automatically set work, should my child have to self-isolate whilst their year group remains in school

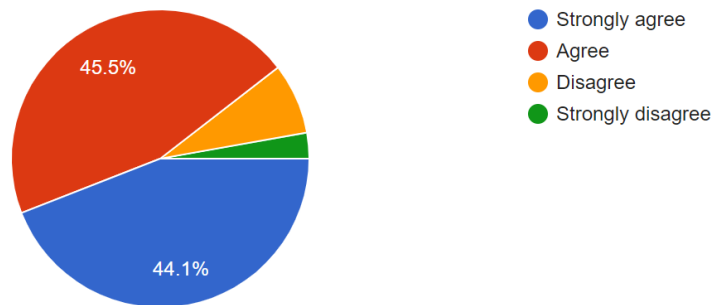
The school's contingency plans for a blend of live and asynchronous activities, in the event of my child's year group having to work from home, are sensible and workable for our household

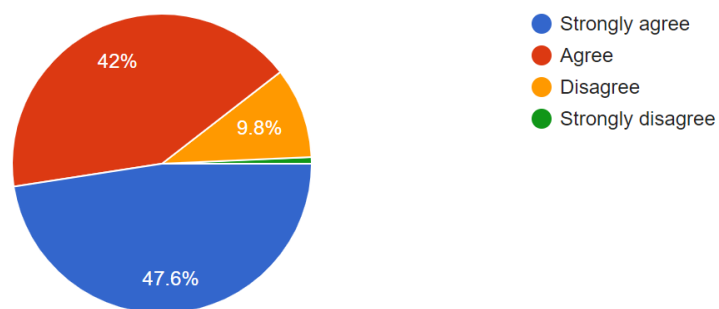
The school's contingency plans to deliver a narrowed down weekly timetable, in the event of my child's year group having to work from home, are sensible to allow for the home learning environment
