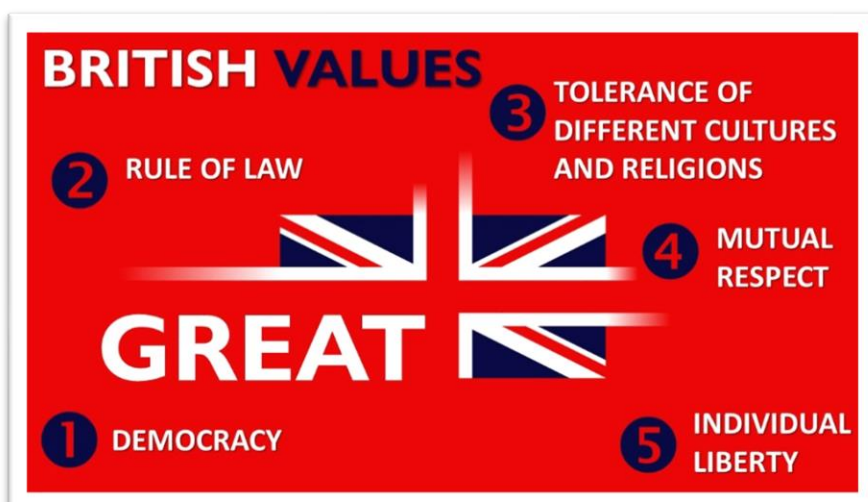
### **Head Student Hustings**

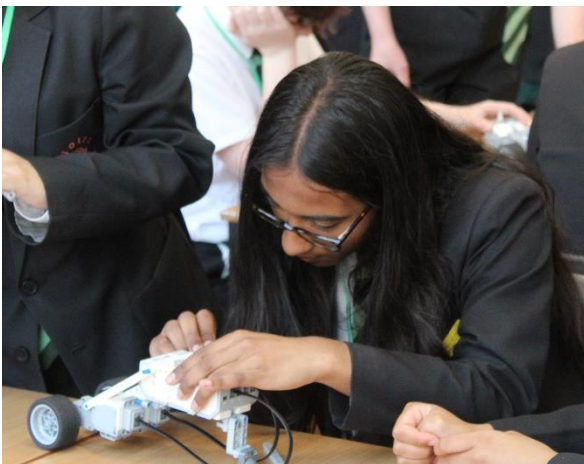
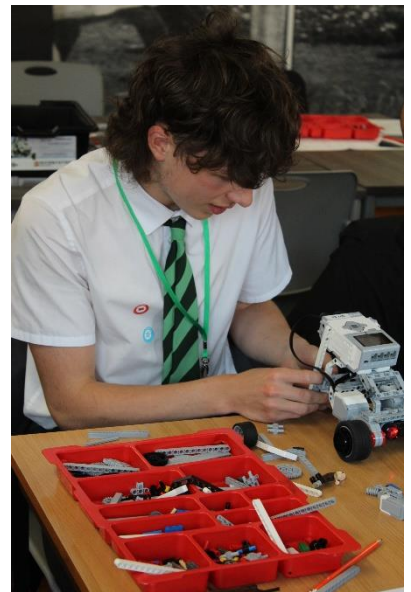
## STEM DAY

Please note that there are limited spaces which will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Registrations close on 31st August 2023, so please register early to avoid disappointment.

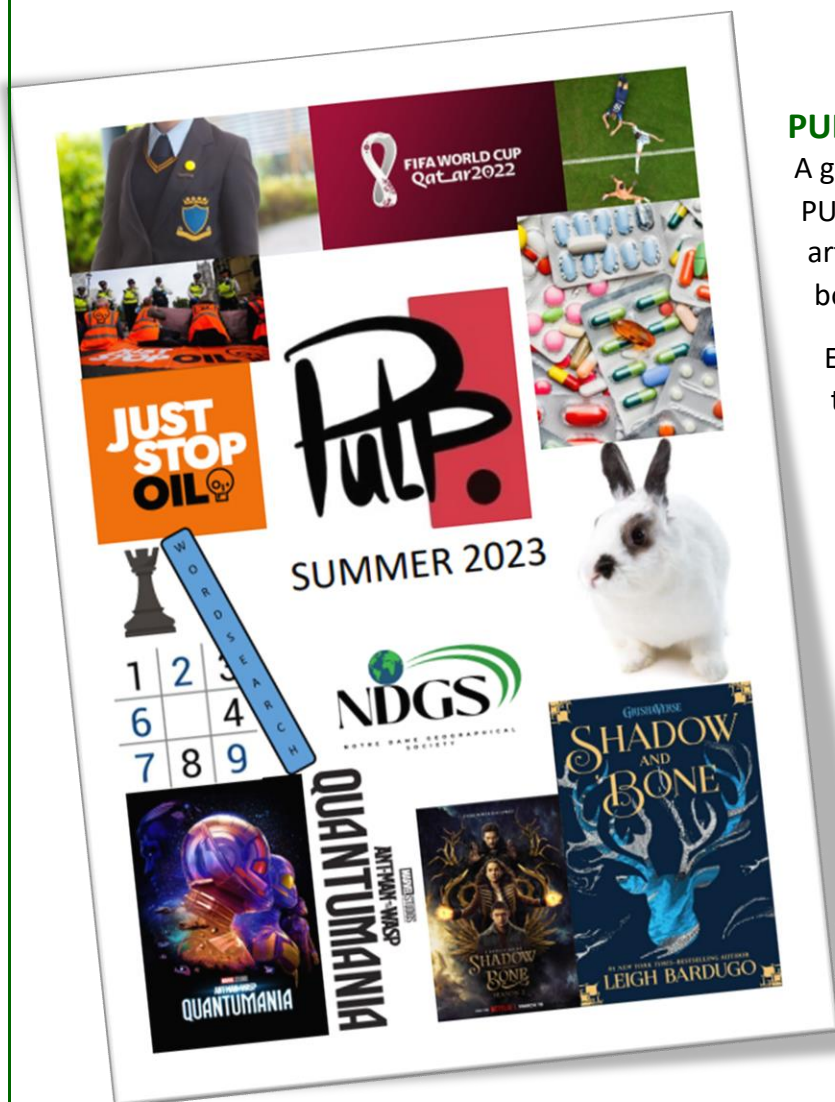

## USEFUL INFO

Please use public transport where possible. All events are within walking distance of the train and bus stations.

**Park & Ride** will run late buses until 10:45pm between the Airport and Thickthorn on Saturday 8 July.

**City centre car parks** will open as usual, but users of Castle Quarter main car park will be asked to use the 'top exit' when leaving.

**All bus services** will operate normal timetables but there may be some disruption during the procession when they will be diverted away from Castle Meadow and the stops will close between 2pm-6pm. During this time, buses will use the Bus Station or their usual stops on St Stephens Street. After 6pm, buses will run from the stops on Castle Meadow again.

**Road closures** - vehicular access to some roads in the city centre will be restricted during the procession and at other times - please check at [www.norwich.gov.uk/lmw](http://www.norwich.gov.uk/lmw) for details.

**Lost People and Lost Property** - please approach a member of security or one of our stewards who will assist you.

**Accessible viewing areas** - available during the procession on Castle Meadow opposite the junction of Opie Street. Also at the front of the stages at City Hall and in ChapelField Gardens. Please book spaces in advance at [events@norwich.gov.uk](mailto:events@norwich.gov.uk) or by calling 01603 989300.

**Toilets** - including accessible and baby changing facilities will be available throughout ChapelField Gardens and on St Peters Street. Accessible and baby changing facilities will also be available on Castle Meadow during the procession. The 'Changing Places' toilet at The Forum and public toilets in the Market will be open all day.

**First Aid points** - ChapelField Gardens and Bethel Street. Please approach an event steward or member of our security team to assist you.

**Water points** - available in ChapelField Gardens and The Forum.
