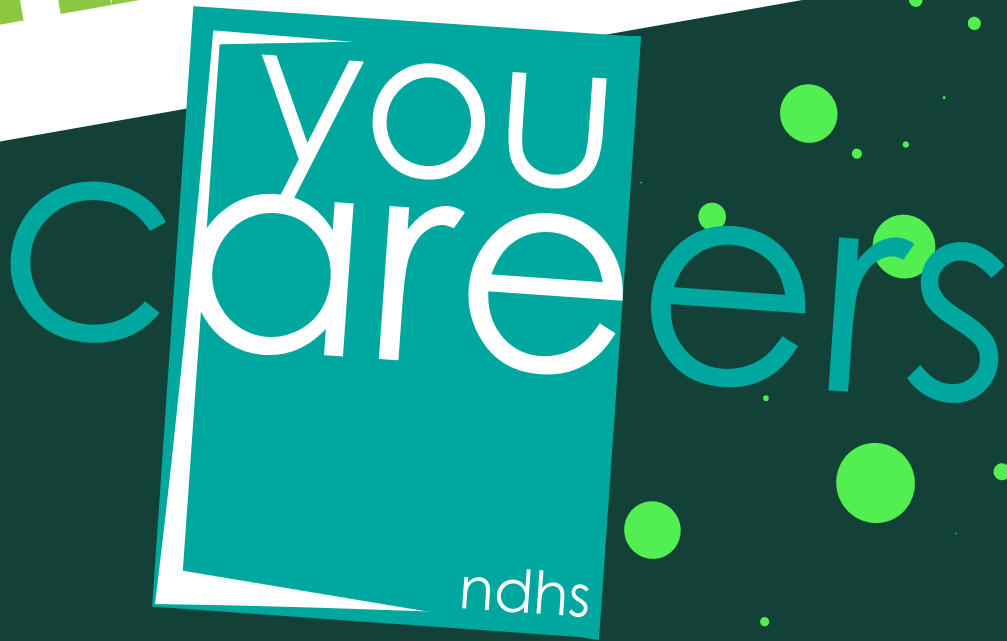

WHAT IS WORK SHADOWING?

Work shadowing, is an opportunity to watch a pro do what they do best. Unlike a work experience placement, you won't usually do the job. Instead, you'll observe your "host" as they carry out their day-to-day activities.

What does it involve?

On a work shadowing placement, you'll be buddied up with a staff member, who you'll stick with as they carry out their daily tasks. It's likely that they'll explain their work to you as you go along, and you'll be able to ask them questions as you go along.

Tips for your placement

Be considerate: The person you're shadowing will be trying to do their job.

Keep your questions to things you can only find out from your host.

For example, you can find out what qualifications you need online.

Pay attention and be interested. Your host is giving up their time to help you!

Describe the host's role within the company.

What are their responsibilities?

What breaks does the host get during a working day?

END OF THE DAY

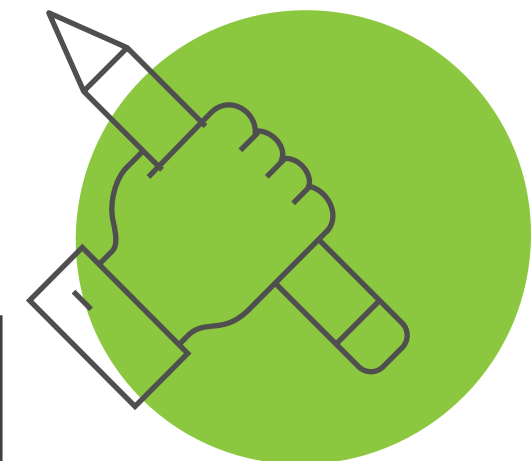
