Why do you think stereotyping happens?




What types of jobs are most often stereotyped?



What factors play a role in the stereotypes we might have, in terms of employment? (E.g. gender, race, sexual preference...)




Come up with a few jobs and note down what stereotypes might go alongside them. E.g. Librarian = glasses, "nerdy", old...


