Anti-Bullying Week

We are an inclusive community that ensures that everyone feels safe and welcome.

We have marked Anti-Bullying week with a special video played in registration time. It emphasises the importance of being a positive bystander and speaking out against any forms of bullying.

In Y7-8 PSHEE we have learnt about the importance of talking to an adult if we feel anxious or upset. In all Years students have been shown how to get in contact with our Safeguarding Team. Each year group have

got their own page on our website which includes information on who they can contact for difference forms of advice. <u>Y7 | Y8 | Y9 | Y10 | Y11 | Y12/13</u>

We discussed why young people are sometimes hesitant talking to adults about what concerns them. Students have fed back that they would like adults to follow this advice:

- **BE CALM:** Help the young person to feel comfortable and supported
- **BE FOCUSSED:** Do not be distracted by something else
- SLOW DOWN: Give them time to tell their story
- **REFLECT BACK:** show that you understand how the child is feeling
