As we move towards the end of term, we finish with our usual celebrations. The Christmas Concert is this evening. Thank you in advance to Mrs Selwood and Ms Curtis for their commitment to music and the musicians at NDHS. Prize evening is on Tuesday 19th and the Carol Service on Wednesday 20th. As you know, the **school closes at 1.25pm on Wednesday 20**th. There is no 901 or 902 bus service and pupils travelling in those directions will need to get on a public bus.



Due to inflation and the cost of food, **Aspens, our excellent caterer, has had to raise prices**. From January, the Main Course price will move from £2.15 to £2.30, and the Meal Deal will change from £2.40 to £2.53. The daily allowance for pupils in receipt of free school meals will increase accordingly to £2.53 per day. I know this is disappointing for families and I appreciate that the timing of the news is not good, but I can testify that the value and quality remains excellent.

At this time of year, it's important that I thank staff for their hard work, professionalism and commitment to our young people. Thank you to the students for the effort you have given to your studies, your good manners, attentive nature and the joy you bring to the school. Thank you to parents and carers for supporting your children and young people with their organisation and motivation and guiding them on the right path. 
