

Supports young asylum seekers and refugees in Norfolk, between the ages of 11 and 25 with social activities and access to education

NORWICH CITY OF SANCTUARY

A network of charities that works towards making Norwich a more welcoming place to asylum seekers and refugees.

UEA UNIVERSITY OF SANCTUARY

Supports refugees and asylum seekers who wish to study at degree or above. They offer some scholarships to study at the UEA. Organise UEA refugee week.





WELCOME WHEELS

Provide second-hand bikes for refugees and asylum seekers in Norwich

SHELTER

Provide support for all about housing
