Well done to Y13 on their completion of the mock exams, a calm and purposeful approach!

I reminded **Y11**, although the same is true for Y13, that they are in a great position. They have parents and carers that care deeply for them, they have expert staff and teachers that are right with them, accompanying them on their journey, and crucially they <u>still have time</u>.
