He begins to suspect something is not quite right on the day he arrives when he spots a mysterious woman out in the frozen mists. But little can prepare him for the solitude of the house itself. His guardian is rarely seen, and there's a malevolent force lurking in an old hallway mirror.

As the chilling suspense builds, Michael realizes that the house and its grounds harbor many more secrets-both dead and alive.

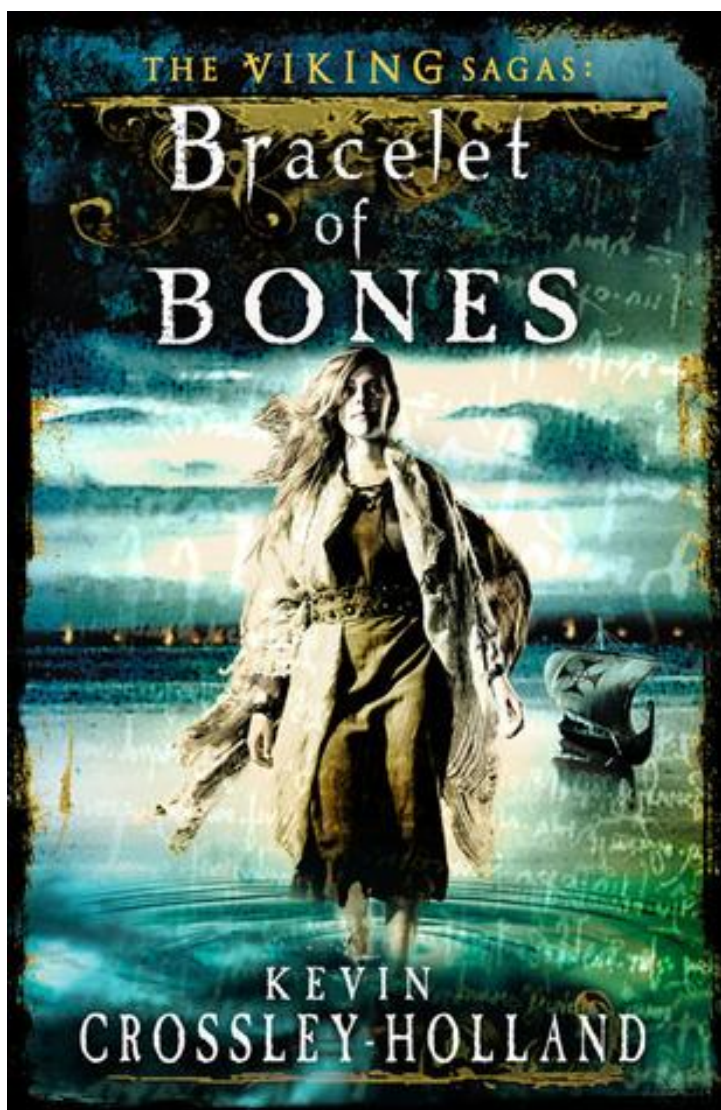

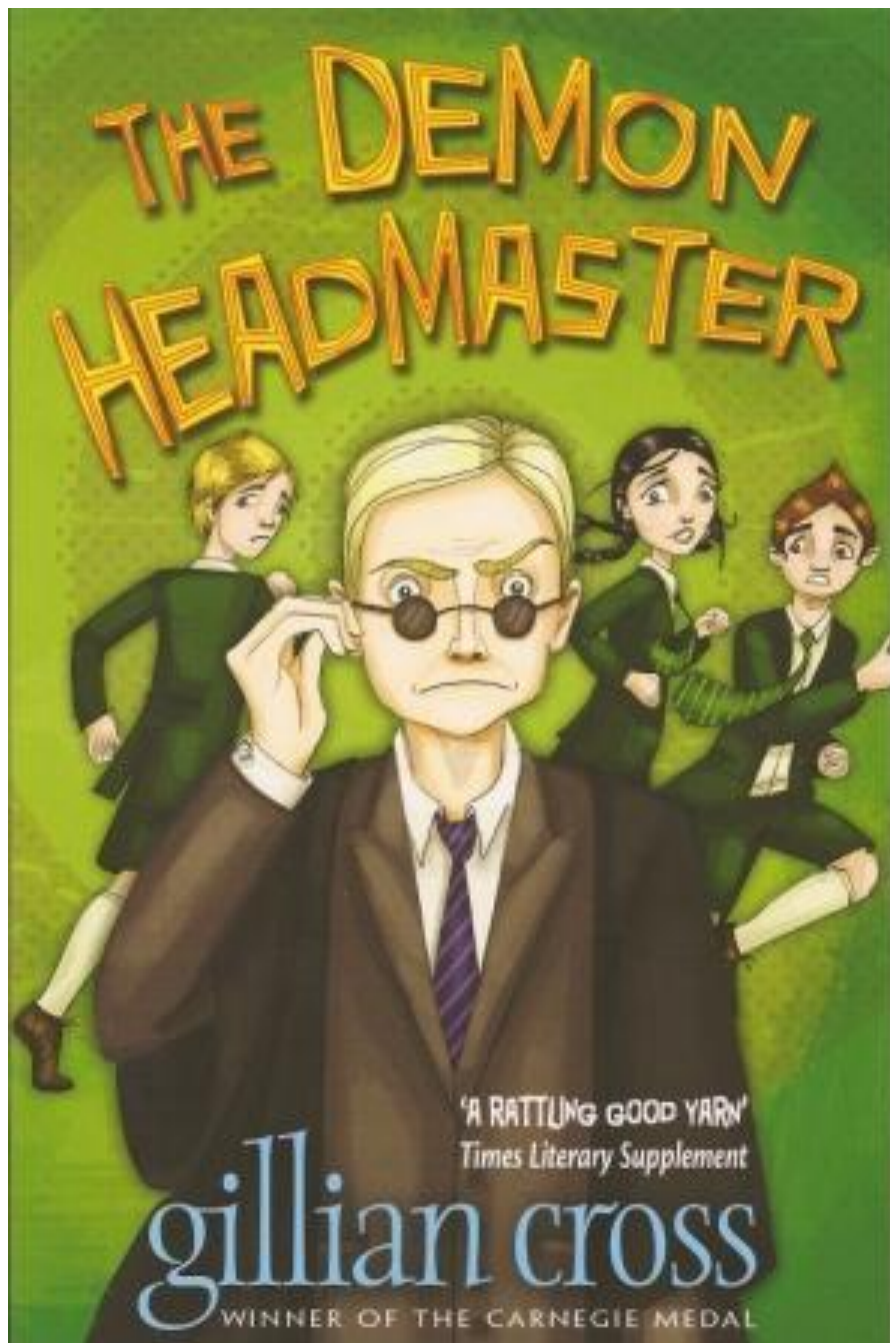


The Demon Headmaster by Gillian Cross

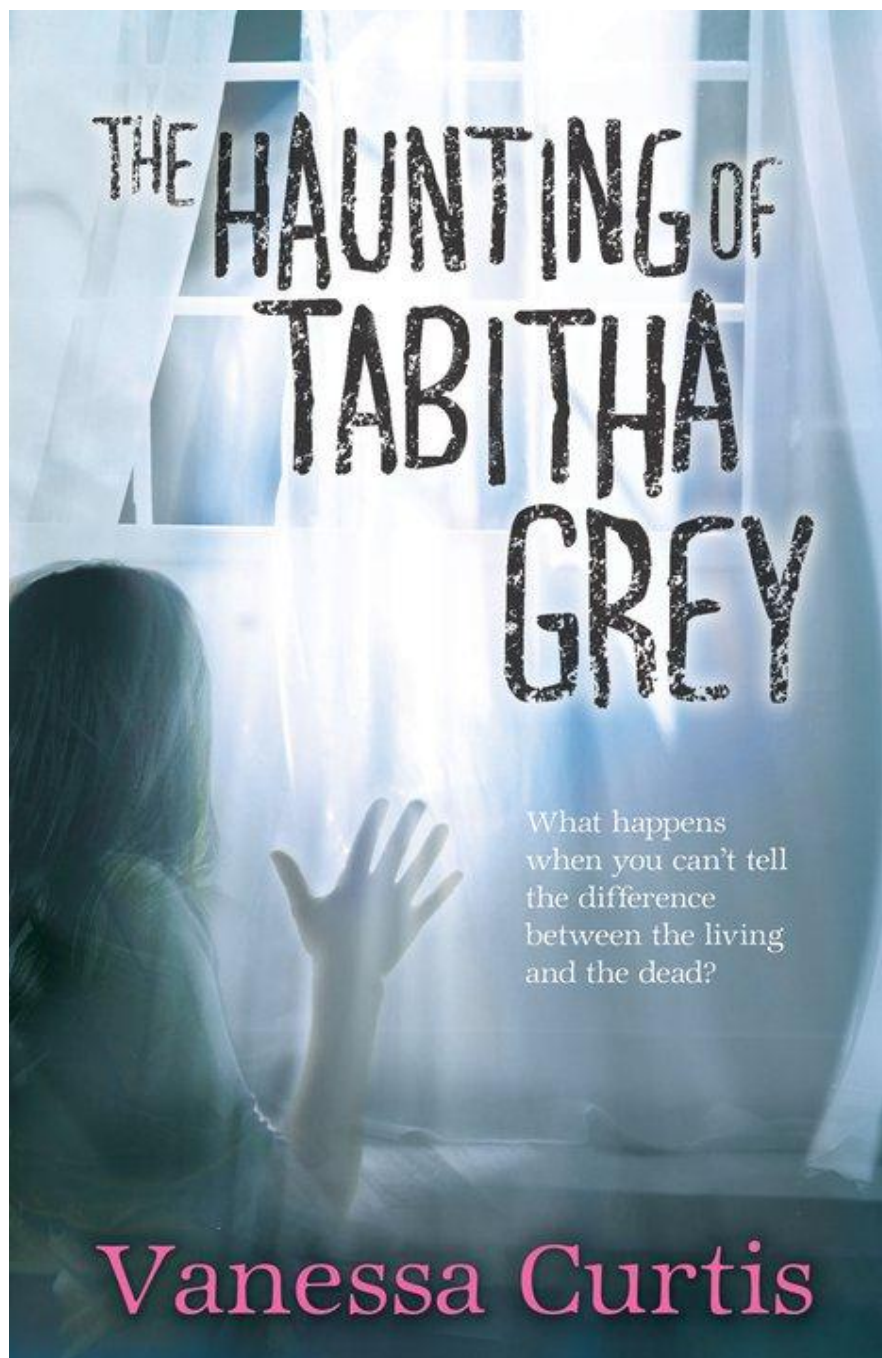
The Haunting of Tabitha Grey

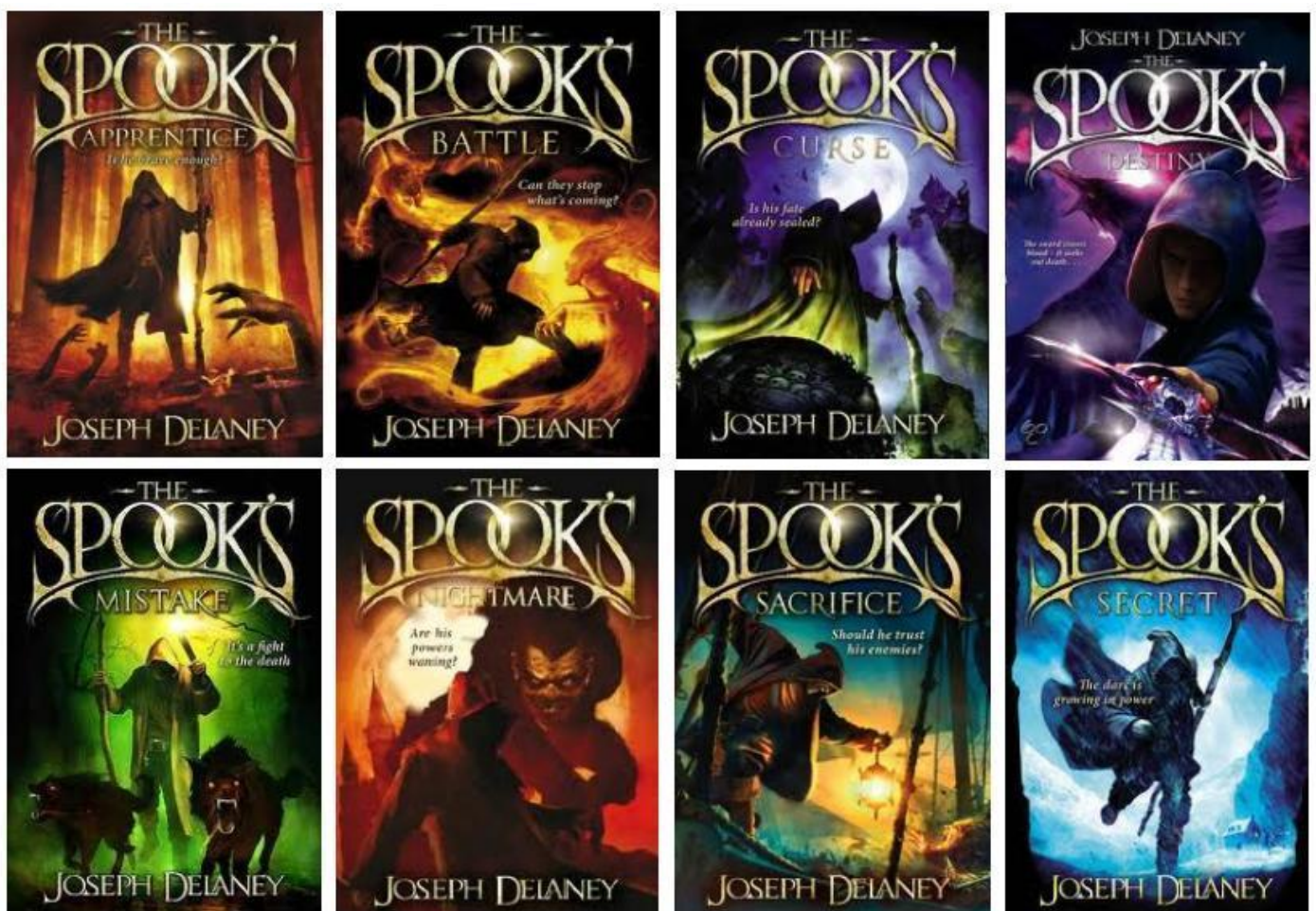
Wardstone Chronicles by Joseph Delaney

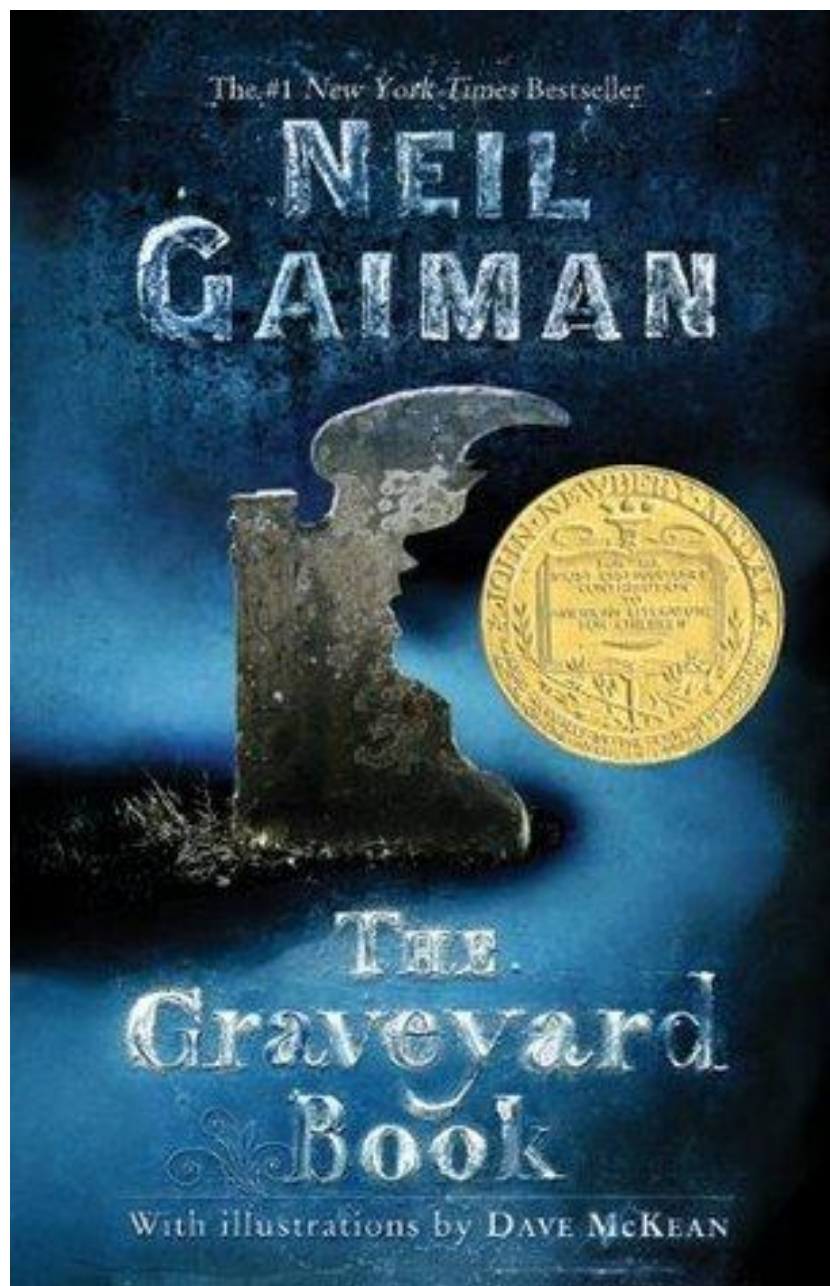


The Graveyard Book by Neil Gaiman

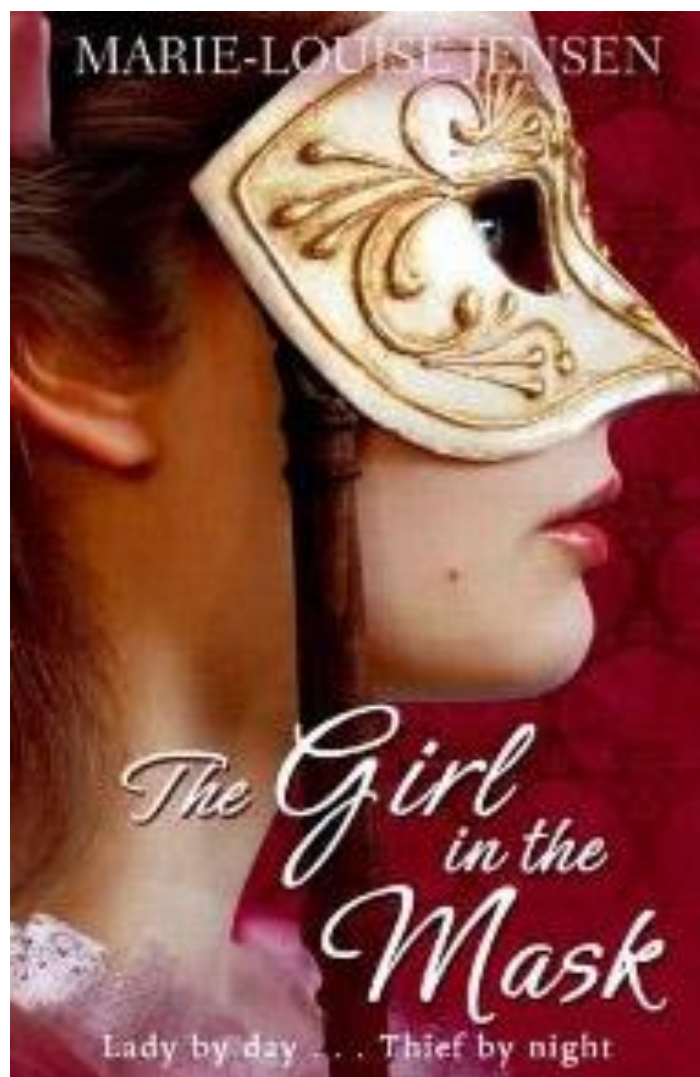


The Girl in the Mask
