

WHO IS SAINT JULIE BILLIART?

Our school was established in 1864 by an order of nuns called the Sisters of Notre Dame. The order was founded by Julie Billiart in France, in 1804.

Julie had a passion for providing all young people with an education, particularly girls. Julie used the image




of a sunflower always turning towards the sun as metaphor for how our lives should be focussed on the goodness of God.

She was canonised in 1969 and her feast day is 13th May.

Courage, strength, and above all, simplicity in order not to allow yourself to be troubled.

Do not allow yourself to be too harassed, but reanimate your faith in order to carry the yoke of the Lord cheerfully.

Do what you can and don't waste time lamenting over what you can't do.

Do what you reasonably can with great peace and simplicity of heart.

Do your best and after that, go on simply. God gives the growth when it pleases Him.

Draw great advantage from all trials.

Follow the poor to the most abandoned places.

For goodness sake, let us use well the time the good God gives us

From time to time, God grants us a sweetness which encourages us so that when it is absent we remember that God's help is indeed here.

Go on from moment to moment. It is the surest way of doing the holy will of God.

God loves a simple heart which does its best.

God asks of us not promises but efforts – sustained and persevering efforts.

Good will alone is not enough; it must also be put into practice.

How great the harvest is everywhere, and how few labourers there are.

How hard and yet joyfully we must fight against temptations and not be afraid of them.

Let us always go on sowing the good seed; then live in the peace of God.

Let us do everything for the love of the good God with the sole aim of pleasing him.

Let us do our best and ask God to do the rest.

Let us follow the good God step by step. Let us not go faster than He does.

Let us go on from day to day. There must be no looking back upon the past, no anxieties about the future. I repeat, about the future!

Let us keep close the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Let us practice great simplicity with the good God; only looking at the good we can do.

Let us preserve the spark of faith which still exists in our

society by the grace of the good God.

Let us rest in the Lord; God turns all things together into good for those who love God.

Let us stand fast in times of darkness.

Let us support each other by our prayers which are feeble in themselves but strong through the merits of Jesus Christ.

Let us try to acquire a sense of the holy presence of the good God.

Listen to the Spirit of the good God and do nothing until you have prayed to God to know what God asks of you.

Much courage and great patience. In time the good God will show you what ought to be done.

My God, patience!

My heart utters but one cry, "My God, what do you want me to do?

My wish for you is great peace and union among you.

The more generous you are with God, the more liberal God will be with you.

The work of the good God requires persons who labour every day at becoming perfect.

There is much more merit in living with imperfect people than in living with saints.

There is nothing more contrary to the Spirit of God in prayer than wanting to see and understand everything.

Things do not always depend on us. We must want what God wants. He sometimes wants to see our faith and confidence in him.

Time is a great master; I prefer to let it pass. It will teach us many things.

To do some good, it must cost something.

Virtue must animate us to do everything well for the greater glory of the good God.

We are what we want to be by the efforts we are willing to make.

We have a long way to go before we are perfect. Let us

trudge on every day one step further!

Who is Sr. Dorothy Stang?

Sister Dorothy was a Notre Dame nun from America. She moved to Brazil, dedicating her life to defending the rainforest and its native people.


She spoke out against the destruction of the forest by illegal loggers and ranchers.

Sister Dorothy received many death threats to stop



her from speaking out. However, she chose not to abandon the people and the forest she cared for.

Sister Dorothy believed that the rainforest is vital to all our lives. She often wore a t-shirt with a quote in Portuguese which translates as *'The death of the forest is the end of our life'*. Tragically, Sister Dorothy was assassinated on 12th February 2005. As she faced her killers, she read out loud the following passage from her bible.



'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied. Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.'

Matthew 5:9

She was shot 6 times and abandoned in the forest.

Thousands of people attended her funeral.
